The interscholastic athletic program at Holton-Arms School embodies the school's mission to cultivate the potential of young women through the education of the mind, soul, and spirit. Our dynamic athletic program provides an arena for the development of life and leadership skills. Physical and mental challenges in a team context cultivate resilience, responsibility, tenacity of purpose, and a commitment to others. Students are given numerous opportunities to develop, excel, and nurture the skills necessary to live healthy active lives. We are committed to developing programs where leaders are cultivated and winning is met with humility and grace.

The athletics facilities feature a double gymnasium, indoor competition-size pool, seven outdoor tennis courts, two softball fields, a synthetic turf field, a Bermuda grass field, state of the art fitness center, three dance studios, and an all-weather outdoor track.

In the Upper School, the Athletic Department works with individuals to help them find balance among academic, artistic, and athletic responsibilities. The Athletic Department works to minimize conflicts and helps students to balance the demands of a competitive athletic program and their challenging academic schedule.

Holton competes in the Independent School League (ISL) with 15 area schools. In Swimming and Diving, Holton is a member of the Washington Metropolitan Prep School Swimming and Diving League (WMPSSDL). Crew participates in the WMIRA (Washington Metro Interscholastic Rowing Association). Ice Hockey competes in the Mid-Atlantic Girls Hockey League (MAGHL).

The salary range for this position is \$70,000 to \$100,00 depending on experience. Each student is part of either the Blue Team or the White Team. The connection can go back generations; alumnae daughters are part of the same team as their mothers, likewise for sisters, aunts, and cousins. Over the course of the year, there are opportunities to demonstrate Blue and White spirit to earn points for your team. At the start of each school year, Blue and White team leaders, elected by their peers, visit all three divisions assigning team colors to new girls in the community.

Spirit Week

This all-school week-long event promotes community spirit and sisterhood across all grade levels. A hallmark is the Panther Pride Parade. During the parade, each class dresses to fit a class theme, the jazz band plays from a float, faculty and staff dress-up, and good times are had by all as Blue and White teams engage in an enormous freeze dance competition.

Senior Spirit Day

Senior Spirit Day takes place every spring on the last day of classes for Seniors.Seniors decorate campus and then line the entrance of the School to celebrate their time at Holton and cheer the arrival of fellow students, parents, and teachers. Following these festivities, freshmen, sophomores, juniors, faculty, and staff sing songs to the seniors, which usually results in a lot of crying. The seniors then sing a song to the people they will leave behind as they head for life beyond Holton.
